Today I am writing to ask for your help in one additional way. Recently, at the suggestion of Jessica Strader, the Board of Deacons began a new ministry to the congregation called *What's for Dinner?* Realizing that at times, some members are unable to meet their own food/nutrition needs, *What's for Dinner?* will serve as the congregation food bank for members and friends of the congregation.

While the initial plan was to include some home-cooked frozen meals, currently we are focusing on the following items, which will be stored in a cabinet in the church basement: pasta, sauce, rice, canned chili, canned soup, cereal, mac and cheese, peanut butter, jelly, fruit cups, granola bars, canned tuna, crackers, canned veggies and multivitamins.

As the church remains closed during the current Stay at Home Order, if you are able to support this ministry, please call me at 215-337-5623 and arrange to leave your food contribution outside a back door of the church, and I will take it to the pantry.

If you are in need of food at any time, please call me at the same number, and I will gladly arrange to deliver it.



### Al Schagen's Faith Journey Postscript - March 15, 2020



During the past few days, since I shared my faith journey at Wednesdayos Lenten Supper, love reflected. As I presented I got emotional and as a result, I did not share a lot of what is in my heart about my faith and how First Pres Church has been a vital part of my life. When you are 93 years old, you have a lot of stories to tell. I would like share a few nuggets of my life, faith journey and as a member of First Pres for 60 years.

As a child and youth, I grew up in a Presbyterian Church in Paterson with wonderful Sunday School teachers. I recall as a teenager, I would sit in the sanctuary alone and felt Godos presence in the silence. When Mina and I moved to Glen Rock, we were looking for a church. From the first time we attended First Pres, we felt welcomed and the warmth of the congregation.

Mina and I joined the church in 1959, and we become very active members.

I served as Clerk of Session for 35 years, and Mina was active as a Deacon and spearheaded church fundraisers, antique shows and dinners. Over the years, Mina strong faith helped deepen my faith. We had a wonderful faith journey as a married couple until she passed in 2005.

The loss of Mina and the death of my daughter, Wendy, a year later tested my faith. My Christian foundation and faith made it possible for me to endure those difficult times. First Pres Church has been the saving grace that has sustained me.

My daily spiritual routine in praying helps me to trust in Gods grace each day. I believe a church is not a building, but the church is the congregation. First Pres congregation is my family. Ion grateful for the relationships I have with such a loving and caring congregation, and how it has deepened my faith and sustained me.
