### Dear Friends,

As members of the Body of Christ, we are commanded to love one another. How that love is expressed will depend upon circumstances and needs.

As members of the congregation grow older, become less mobile and/or suffer from illness, it can become difficult or impossible for them to attend worship services and other church activities. In fact, as church members age, they sometimes find themselves homebound, seldom leaving home except for an occasional trip to the doctor. This can lead to feelings of isolation and loneliness.

During such times, when members are unable to come to church, the church can show its love for them by coming to them.

With those thoughts in mind, the Board of Deacons has recently formed a Visitation Team for the purpose of visiting older adult congregants who are homebound. A regular visit by a member of the Visitation Team will remind our homebound members that they have not been forgotten; they are valued members of the congregation; and they are not alone as they face the difficulties of growing older.

Although the Visitation Team is a ministry of the Board of Deacons, members of the congregation are invited and encouraged to be part of the team.

Do you enjoy visiting people who are sick or lonely in order to bring them a little cheer? Are you a good listener, who can offer a word of comfort or perhaps simply listen if someone needs to talk? Are you able to offer an hour a month to visit a homebound member of the congregation? If so, God may be calling you to become a member of the Visitation Team!

## Sunday School News





## **Endowment Corner**

As we enter into the lazy, hazy days of summer it would be wonderful if we could all empty ourselves of worry about things that we can do little about and focus more on what we can do. It takes a lot of money to have a fabulous wardrobe which has no impact on a single soul on the planet. But it takes no money at all to offer a kind word every day to those you meet. It can make someone's day or even sometimes change a life.

On the Endowment committee we're somewhere in-between the two extremes. We're tasked with raising money so we can tend to the business of helping those who need more than a kind word. They need food to eat or shelter to protect them from the elements. Jesus' command is simple..."Follow me". I doubt He's impressed by a collection of Coach handbags or Manolo Blahnik shoes, but would be filled with joy to see us notice who needs food or shelter and act on it on a regular basis.

Author Anne Lamott laments on her own faith journey in her most recent book, *Hallelujah Anyway*, During a bad day she makes a trip to the Mall for a temporary spirit lifting exercise to buy a pretty new blouse she had seen. She knows the high won't last and she sighs, "Who was it who said that to get into heaven, you need a letter of recommendation from the poor?" In fact, Lamott is not anti- consumerism, but she is mindful of the lure of quick fixes and the more permanent fix offered by Jesus simple command, to "Follow me".

What has all this got to do with Endowment? Possibly everything. Our goal is to heed Jesus' command.
