When you need help and are willing to accept it from the church, you are, in effect, helping the church. You are helping us live out our mission statement, which reads in part: "We are a welcoming community formed in Christ, committed to sharing his love with others" Therefore, the next time you need help, please make your need known to your church family. In so doing, you will be helping another person of faith and the church as a whole. And who knows? The next time someone else needs help, you may be the one to provide it.


Come to Second Saturday Worship!
